- All internal plumbing has been completed and thanks to NJ & T McMullen Pty Ltd for their generous donation to fulfil the job within the submitted quotation price although the time frame extended from the original due to the tree root problem.
- The disabled toilet is installed with the tiling complete and now Neil (and helpers) are moving on to the kitchen.
- **The power is on!!** The restoration of the power and lighting is underway and the volunteers continue to perform the work which will enable the operation of equipment when finalised. We have hot water, fridge and stove connected and the lights should be this month.
- Security screens are nearly there.
- External doors are now secured with the metalwork area door to be completed in the near future.
- The windows panes are nearly fully restored to prevent the rain (hopefully) and wind to be diverted outside.
