Promotional

Membership fees

We're trying to get everyone's membership into sync with the June 30 financial year. So any new members and those of you in arrears will soon receive an invoice for amounts outstanding (prorata) until the end of June. Members who have joined recently and paid for a full year will have any additional money credited on a prorata basis to the next financial year. At the end of June 2014, all members will receive a new invoice for the 2014-2015

with the option to pay for a full year or quarterly. Those opting for quarterly payments will then receive quarterly invoices thereafter.

Please be aware that if you are not financial you are not covered by our insurance and cannot therefore do any work or use any tools in the shed.

Relocation from Knight Street

The members decided early this year to start to meet at the new William Street site rather than at Knight Street. As a result we are in the process of shifting things from the old site to the new one. Many thanks again to our friends at Life Without Barriers for their continuing support for the Whyalla Men's Shed.

Shed days

This is a bit of a moving feast at present because so many of you are keen to see the work on the new site move forward apace. Unless the weather is extreme $(40^{\circ} \text{ C or more})$ the shed is open on Wed and Thursdays from at least 10-12:00. Members are welcome to go to the shed at other times providing there are no less than two people at any one time. If you happen to be driving past and you see the gate open, then pop inside to see what is going on. Where possible in the future we will send an email out advising when members will be working at William Street.

We have billy boiling, tea, coffee, milk and biscuits and some spring water on tap - \$2:00 subs on the day as usual.

Termites

Termite control has been completed. There are some termite affected door jambs that need to be removed and replaced.

Windows and doors

We have security grills now on the front entrance and on all west and south facing windows. These still need to be painted as do the fascias and windows. Most of the broken glass has now been removed and there is a lot of glass to be replaced. Once all external painting is done and the doors at the rear southern side have been replaced we will do the glazing work. Other externals doors are also being repaired.

Power and plumbing

We have a couple of generators on loan until the power is reconnected. Despite asking most of the electrical contractors in the town to quote we have had limited interest in the work. This is a big job due to the age of the premises and the vandalism over the years. It will also be more expensive than we had first thought. Notwithstanding, we expect electrical work to commence in the next 10 days and with the help of a contractor supported by some of our *ex-sparky* members, we hope to have the first stage completed by about mid-march. Further upgrades will be subject to additional funds.

Toilets facilities are a bit dubious at the moment and reserved for no. 1's only! The plumbing contractor should be starting this week and we are hoping to have this work completed by end February, including installation of the disabled toilet and hand basin. We'll be looking for people with good tiling skills and some spare floor and wall tiles thereafter!
